UNIVERSITY OF WOLVERHAMPTON

- Degree classification: 2:2 or above
- Grade C or above in GCSE English, Mathematics & Science
- You must have at least three years of full-time work experience to be eligible to apply
- Trainees will be required to pass the skills tests before starting the course
- School experience before applying to the course is highly favourable
- Applicants must complete an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service check (prior to taking a place)
- Trainees must agree to abide by the University of Wolverhampton's Code of Professional Conduct and Fitness to Practice and complete relevant checks to determine capacity to teach
